### March of Dimes-Suburban Maryland Reports Governor O'Malley and Lt. Governor Brown Have Announced That the Maryland Infant Mortality Rate Has Dropped for a Second Year in a Row . . . .

Governor Martin O'Malley today joined by Lt. Governor Anthony G. Brown, Baltimore City Mayor Stephanie Rawlings-Blake, and other state and local officials, announced that Maryland's infant mortality rate has dropped substantially for a second consecutive year to the lowest rate recorded for the state. "Sustained progress against infant mortality requires a number of efforts and improvements over many years," said Dr. Joshua M. Sarfstein, Department of Health and Mental Hygiene Secretary. "We are updating our strategy to do everything we can to improve birth outcomes."

### CENG Nuclear Power Plant Provided Summer Hands-on Training for CSM Students Preparing for Energy Jobs . . .

Driving under the high tension lines just inside the gates of the power plant was as energizing as it was motivational for 18 College of Southern Maryland (CSM) students arriving for their first day of hands-on training at the Constellation Energy Nuclear Group, LLC (CENG) plant in Calvert County. The students, many completing their first year of CSM's Nuclear Engineering Technology: Instrumentation and Control (NET) associates degree program, spent the summer connecting their classroom instruction at CSM's Center for Nuclear Energy Training in Prince Frederick to training experiences inside a working nuclear facility. Over the six-week summer cooperative education/internship program, students toured the CENG Calvert Cliffs facility, attended lectures and courses led by CENG instructors, and rotated through electrical and mechanical maintenance, instrumentation and control, chemistry and radiation protection systems to get a flavor of the work conducted in those shops. During the final two weeks of the program, students chose their preferred field among the systems shops and were matched with CENG mentors who they accompanied on job assignments. "You will get a feel for not only the equipment but the organization and procedures", CENG Supervisor of Technical Training Al Fissel told students. "The opportunity for Calvert Cliffs employees to mentor and train has been a phenomenal experience",

said George Gellrich, Calvert Cliffs Nuclear Power Plant Site Vice President. "Everyone was very eager to share their knowledge and experience with this next generation of nuclear workers and the students' energy and enthusiasm have invigorated the team and they are looking forward to working with more CSM students in the future." **"Send Calvert to College" Campaign . . . .** Southern Maryland College Access Network (SoMD CAN) is pleased to announce the beginning of their "Send Calvert to College" Fundraising Campaign. SoMD CAN is a non-profit organization that has been providing college access and success programming to high school students and their families in Southern Maryland since its inception in 2006. They provide families with the tools to achieve success in higher education through a three tiered approach: In school sessions, community workshops, and scholarship coordination. The in-school, curriculum-based program is delivered to juniors and seniors once a week and explores a wide range of topics like career selection, appropriate college selection, college admissions process, understanding financial aid, searching for scholarships, one-on-one counseling for participants, preparing for college life and much more. Financial aid workshops are offered throughout the year to educate families on options for scholarships and financing a post-secondary education. Workshop offerings also included personal guidance and assistance on filing the universally used FAFSA. Finally, coordination of the Calvert Local Scholarship Application that allows a student to use one form to apply to scholarships from local community support groups such as the Rotary Clubs, Kiwanis Clubs, and LEAP Forward. Twenty two organizations participated in the second year of this application offering over \$50,000 awarded to local students. SoMD CAN's mission is to increase the college-going rate amongst Southern Maryland graduates with specific focus on first-generation and underserved populations. Their goals are to build awareness and preparedness for the college admissions and financial aid process with the intent to build a local workforce. The organization cannot continue to bring this valuable service to our community without the support from our local business community and investors in our young people's futures. **Lifelong Learning- Lyme Disease . . .** Visit Calvert Library Prince Frederick on Monday night, October 24, 2011 at 6:30 pm for a viewing and lively discussion about the film *Under Our Skin* which is a controversial look at the science and politics of the disease and the personal stories of those whose lives have been affected. A gripping tale of microbes, medicine and money, this movie tells the story of chronic Lyme disease. In the early 1970's, a mysterious ailment was discovered among children living around the town of Lyme, CT. What was first diagnosed as isolated cases of juvenile arthritis eventually became known as Lyme disease, an illness triggered by spiral-shaped bacteria. According to the film, each year thousands go undiagnosed or misdiagnosed, told that their symptoms are "all in their head." The Centers for Disease Control agrees that more than 300,000 people may acquire Lyme disease each year. The film tells the stories of patients and physicians fighting for their lives and livelihoods. From a few doctors who risk their medical licenses, to patients who once led active lives but now can barely walk, the film uncovers a hidden world whose very existence is a subject of controversy among insurers, interns, politicians and patients. ### Patuxent Habitat for Humanity Celebrates World Habitat Day 2011 With Donation Drive . . .

In recognition of World Habitat Day 2011, St. Nicholas Lutheran Church, located at 1450 Plum Point Rd. Huntingtown, Maryland is holding a donation drop off on Saturday, October 1, 2011 from 10 AM until 2 PM. Donations of home improvement goods, like furniture, home accessories, building materials and appliances will be accepted to help Patuxent Habitat for Humanity fund the construction of Habitat homes in Calvert and St. Mary's Counties. The ReStores accept donated goods, which they sell to the general public at a fraction of the retail price. Patuxent Habitat operates two ReStores, located at 8900 Chesapeake Avenue, North Beach and 21768 S. Coral Drive in Lexington Park. ReStore resale outlets provide an environmentally and socially responsible way to keep good, reusable materials out of the waste stream while providing funding for Habitat's community improvement work. Habitat for Humanity will engage in a month-long observance of the need for safe, decent and affordable shelter beginning on World Habitat Day, Monday, Oct. 3, 2011. World Habitat Day is designated each year by the United Nations as a time to reflect on the dire need for adequate shelter around the globe. In recognition of World Habitat Day and the work Habitat for Humanity has done to alleviate poverty housing, Habitat will dedicate its 500,000th house in Maai Mahiu, Kenya, and raise the walls on its 500,001st house in Paterson, New Jersey. Thirty-nine of Habitat's 500,000 homes have been built, rehabbed or repaired by Patuxent Habitat for Humanity. The ReStore is open Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays 10-5 and Saturday 8-4. ## “The Traveling Apprentice” The Good, The Bad and The Ugly

This month’s Traveling Apprentice schedule was thrown into a tizzy when Irene caused businesses to be so busy dealing with their own issues that the last thing they needed underfoot was a novice. As it turned out, however, Irene afforded me an opportunity to work in a situation where I was able to observe the good, the bad, the ugly, and the disappointing parts of society.

I live in a small private community, a microcosm of society. The community is heavily forested with Tulip Poplars which can soar to upper heights of 150 feet and sport canopy spreads of nearly forty feet. They have very shallow root systems and, consequently, during conditions which existed during Irene of saturated soil and high winds the trees easily topple onto houses and roads. The community is interlaced with three and a half miles of roads, all of which are privately maintained by the community, not the county. Following a storm, it’s staff and private citizens that dig the community out and clear the roads so emergency vehicles can enter.

It was the tree situation that let me view the best of society when I volunteered in an army of neighbors who rolled up their collective sleeves to attack scores of fallen trees covering the roads like pick-up sticks. The army consisted of 60, 70 and even 80 year old men who wielded chain saws into the gathering evening shadows, an army of able bodied men and women and children who worked beside them to roll away cut logs and clear the roads, and an army of neighbors who checked on the elderly, and provided meals to staff and volunteers.

The Corporation for National and Community Service estimates that only about twenty-eight of Americans volunteer. . . meaning seventy-two percent do not. On that particular day it was frustrating to realize that many able bodied men and women were content to let a handful of others struggle

to de-forest the roads but those same hearty individuals would be out in force the next day, blithely walking their dogs, exercising, and driving on the roads cleared by the sweat of their neighbors.

It was the trees that brought out the sordid underbelly of society, the ones who swooped in like vultures to rip off vulnerable citizens . . . like the unlicensed “tree removal expert” with high pressure sales tactics who had dire warnings about a leaning tree and quoted an outrageous price to a nervous female homeowner. . . then decamped with her deposit. (By the way, the tree is still upright, and a reputable, licensed tree removal expert is going to fell the tree for much less than the scammer’s quoted price.)

Irene highlighted the good and the ugly of society but it also pointed out that there are truly resilient individuals in every society. Individuals with indomitable spirits. Individuals like the ninety-one year old woman who headed to her basement with essentials to ride out the storm- -tonic water, a bottle of gin, and two limes.

My kind of woman.
